

Politics in Manasquan

There are four voting districts in Manasquan. They are numbered 1 through 4. They are divided according to population and have approximately the same number of voters. The town, roughly speaking, is divided by the rail road tracks into east and west sections and then by Main St into north and south sections.

District number 1 is west of the rail line and from the north side of main St. to the Wall and Sea Girt borders. District 2 is west of the rail line and from the south side of Main St., to the Brielle and Wall borders. District 3 is east of the rail line and south side of Main St. to the Ocean and Glimmer Glass, District 4 is east of the rail line and from the North side of Main St. to Stockton Lake and the Ocean

If you live in district 1 you vote at the First Aid building on Broad St, District 2 votes at Fire Dept #2 in the plaza, District 3 votes at Borough Hall, corner of Main and Rte 71 second floor, District 4 votes at Fire Dept #1 on Parker Ave.

Each district has a Republican Committeeman and Committeewoman. They are elected to a two year term on even numbered years at the primary election in June. Their responsibilities are to work to get to know the voters in their district, help answer any of the resident's questions about the Republican Party in Manasquan and help the Municipal Chairperson, currently Rich Dunne, fill the Manasquan Republican slate in the general and primary elections. They also work with the County Committee in Freehold to help elect the republican legislative and county candidates.
